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

Kasuga Taisha Shrine

Ancient myths tell us that about 1300 years ago when the national capital was built in Nara, Takemikazuchi-no-mikoto came all the way from Kashima Shrine (Ibaraki Prefecture) to Mt. Mikasa, which is considered a holy mountain, to dwell on its summit "Ukigumo-no-mine" for the prosperity of the nation and happiness of the people. Later on, when Tempyo Culture flourished, the political leader Fujiwara-no-Nagate built magnificent buildings on the present site of the shrine as ordained by Empress Shotoku. On November 9, 768, he enshrined several gods here, namely Futsunushi-no-mikoto from Katori Shrine (Chiba Prefecture), and Amenokoyane-no-mikoto and Himegami from Hiraoka Shrine (Osaka Prefecture). This is how Kasuga Taisha began.



Nara ParkDeer's Are A National Natural Treasure



The deer's at Nara Park are a national natural treasure of Japan. There are 236 male deer's, 715 female deer's and 229 fawns. The 1180 deer's roam freely in and around the park and they are very friendly. Tourists can buy deer senbei's (deer crackers) to feed them. According to local folklore, deer's from this area was considered sacred and divine. Nara Park may be the only place in the world where you can interact with wild deer's in the heart of the city.





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■ Todai-ji Temple Hall Of The Great Buddha

National Treasure

Todai-ji Temple is one of the most famous and historically significant temples in Japan. The temple was constructed in 752 as the head temple of all provincial Buddhist temples of Japan. Todai-ji's main hall, the Big Buddha Hall, is the world's largest wooden building. And the Buddha is 15 meters tall.











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Imai Machinami Koryu Center "Hana Iraka

'Hana Iraka' was built in 1903 in the southeastern part of Imai Town, Nara Prefecture, as the Takaichi County Museum of Education. It is designated as a cultural asset of Nara Prefecture.

The orientation will be held at this historical building, 'Hana-iraka'.









Japanese Kimono Experience

One of the first things people think of when thinking about Japan is a Kimono.

Experience the wearing of a traditional Japanese Kimono, dressed by a professional in the art of Kimono wearing.

What Kind Of Fabrics Are Used?

Traditionally, Kimonos are sewn by hand. The Kimono and Obi are traditionally made of silk, silk brocade, silk crepes and satin weaves. Modern Kimonos are widely available in less expensive easy-care fabrics such as rayon, cotton sateen, cotton, polyester and other synthetic fibers. Silk is still considered the ideal fabric.















<u>Imaicho</u>

Going to Imaicho is like taking a time machine back to the Edo-Period. Imaicho is a unusually large preserved historic district where traditional old-style Japanese houses from the Edo Period still stand. Not only can you walk around the neighborhood but you can actually step inside some of the houses which are more than 350 years old. Being in Imaicho makes you feel like you traveled back to the time where Samurai's and Ninja's roamed the streets.

<u>Japanese Food Culture Experience</u> (Dinner: Kushiyaki, Okonomiyaki, etc.)

ex. Okonomiyaki Experience

Okonomiyaki is a very popular Japanese savory pancake containing a variety of ingredients. The name comes from the word "Okonomi" which means how you like or what you like. And "Yaki" means grill. It is made with a batter of flour and egg, cabbage, vegetables and meat or seafood.













<u>Kashihara-Jingu Shrine</u> (Formal Worship Service)

Kashihara-Jingu Shrine is a Shinto shrine built in 1889 at the site of the Kashiharagu where Japan's first emperor, Emperor Jimmu is said to have acceded the throne. A special VIP experience at Kashihara-Jingu Shrine where a Shinto priest will take you inside the inner reverance hall, which is normally closed to the public and perform a special prayer.









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<u>Kashihara Archeological Research</u> <u>Institute Museum</u>

We display mainly on the excavated materials of the excavation survey conducted by the Ebara Archaeological Research Institute since 1938. The permanent exhibition, "The Yamato Archeology", is based on the standard materials of Japanese archeology, and has become "the history of Japan to see"

<u>Kashihara JA</u> <u>Mahoroba Kitchen</u>

Mahoroba means "Wonderful Place" or "Wonderful Town".

Mahoroba Kitchen offers one of the largest farmers market in Japan, along with a buffet style restaurant, French restaurant and a food court. JA (Japan Agricultural Cooperative) is organized in every prefecture and municipality throughout the country, based on the principle of mutual cooperation, with the purpose of protecting farming and living of its individual members. Most importantly offering the public a safe and secure product. The buffet style restaurant offers fresh local organic vegetables cooked Japanese style.

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Sumo Experience at the Sumo Pavilion

Sumo Pavilion in Katsuragi City is where SUMO began. The Sumo Pavilion is named after Taima-No-Kehaya who is said to be the first Sumo wrestler. This is one of the few places where you can actually get on the life-sized Sumo ring and reenact Sumo.

Normally woman are not allowed in the ring. Take advantage of this rare opportunity ladies! Sumo Pavilion in Katsuragi City may be the only place they let you!

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Japanese Calligraphy Experience

Early Japanese calligraphy was originated from Chinese calligraphy. 4 basic tools are used in Japanese calligraphy. Sumi, is an ink stick. 90% of sumi are now made in the Nara Prefecture. Fude, is a brush. The famouse Nara-Fude originated in Imaicho in Kashihara City, Nara. Washi, is a mulberry paper. Suzuri, is an ink stone to grind the ink stick against. Japanese calligraphy is the ultimate cultural experience.
